Hannah Kim, M.D. Ph.D. is Research Assistant Professor at the Department of Medical Law and Ethics, Division of Medical Humanities and Society, College of Medicine and a researcher at Asian Institute for Bioethics and Health Law (AIBHL) at Yonsei University, South Korea. She graduated College of Medicine, Yonsei University in 2010 and obtained Ph.D. in Healthcare Law from Yonsei University in 2015. She worked as a Fellow at Department of Medical Law at Yonsei University in Mar 2016 – Feb 2017. Now she is a member of Consultation Committee for DTC-GT under the Ministry of Health and Welfare and a member of Institutional Review Board in Severance Hospital, Yonsei University. Her research activities have been focused on advanced biotechnologies and research ethics and, since 2010, she participated numbers of projects, including four ELSI projects. From her writing, mainly 13 journal articles are focused on gene editing, 3D bioprinting technology, precision medicine and bigdata, and AI with the perspectives of privacy, intellectual property rights, universal health coverage and data sharing.
