 - Kazuto Kato, PhD is Professor of Biomedical Ethics and Public Policy at the Graduate School of Medicine, Osaka University, Japan. He has a PhD degree in developmental biology from Kyoto University. After finishing postdoctoral research at the University of Cambridge with Sir John Gurdon, he started to work in the interface between bioscience and society, particularly focusing on ethical and social issues of genomics and stem cell research. He was a member of various international projects/academic societies such as Ethics Committee of Human Genome Organization (HUGO), ELSI group of the International HapMap Project, Steering Committee of the Global Alliance for Genomics and Health. He is currently serving as a member of Ethics and Policy Committee of the ICGC (International Cancer Genome Consortium) and the international network, ELSI 2.0.

Since 2010, he has been a member of the Expert Panel on Bioethics of the Council for Science, Technology and Innovation (CSTI) of the Cabinet Office, Japan.
