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Richard Huxtable is Professor of Medical Ethics and Law and Director of the Centre for Ethics in Medicine, in the Medical School at the University of Bristol, UK. Qualified in law and socio-legal studies, his research primarily concerns end-of-life decision-making, surgical ethics and clinical ethics, and he has published widely in legal, bioethical and medical journals. Richard is the author of *Euthanasia, Ethics and the Law: From Conflict to Compromise* (2007, Routledge), *Law, Ethics and Compromise at the Limits of Life: To Treat or Not to Treat?* (2012, Routledge) and *All That Matters: Euthanasia* (2013, Hodder); he is also co-author/editor of *The Cambridge Medical Ethics Workbook* (2010, Cambridge University Press), *The Voices and Rooms of European Bioethics* (2014, Routledge) and *Ethical Judgments: Re-writing Medical Law* (2016, Hart). Richard edits the Ethics in Clinical Practice section of *BMC Medical Ethics*. A long-standing participant in clinical ethics support, Richard is a member of Bristol's Clinical Ethics Advisory Group and also a trustee of the UK Clinical Ethics Network. He is PI on a major Wellcome Trust collaborative project, *Balancing Best Interests in Healthcare, Ethics and Law* (BABEL). He tweets at @DrRHuxtable.
